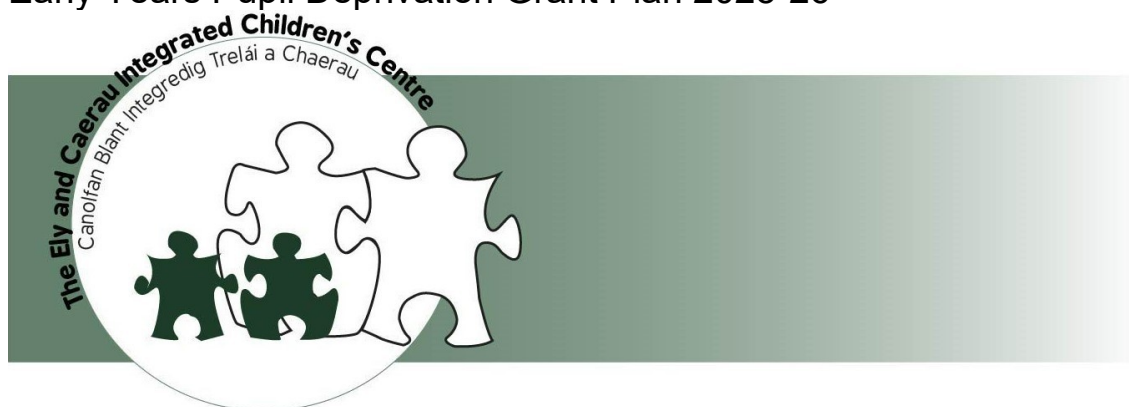

<p>Community and Family Engagement</p> <p>To further develop parent engagement in children's learning</p> <p>£14,500</p>	<p>The Centre has always benefitted from a community engagement worker. The role involves working with families in the community providing support groups and a variety of toddler groups.</p> <p>Our data and observations suggest that early language is delayed for many children in both meithrin and nursery.</p>	<p>To reach more parents who's children attend the center nursery / meithrin.</p> <p>To provide parent and toddler sessions bilingually / through the medium of Welsh with an aim to increase spoken welsh on entry.</p> <p>Early use of welsh language in parent and toddler groups will support children's welsh language development</p> <p>Additional language groups for parents to support early language development.</p>	<p>The number of nursery / meithrin parents accessing groups has increased.</p> <p>Early welsh language phrases are being used in parents and toddler groups</p> <p>Parent questionnaires show that parents are using more stories and rhymes with their children at home.</p>

<p>To improve the impact of interventions within the setting</p> <p>£14,500</p>	<p>Language and wellbeing interventions are offered and in previous years good progress has been made.</p> <p>One staff member will be time tabled to work in short bursts with targeted groups or individuals.</p>	<p>All interventions to have a clear entry and exit system based on wellbeing and involvement screening and language assessments through observation. Pre and post measures to be used. ALNCO to meet regularly with intervention lead to monitor progress made.</p>	<p>The impact of intervention programmes is clearly measured, documented and shared. Intervention data demonstrates progress for all learners.</p>
<p>To ensure all children have access to enrichment activities to support their learning</p> <p>£400</p>	<p>Providing first hand, real-life experiences and high quality learning resources are an essential part of engaging pupils in their learning and is part of our curriculum offer.</p>	<p>A range of enrichment activities are planned and closely linked to the children's interests and fascinations. Funding ensures all children are able to access these. Experiences include forest school, beach school, library visits</p>	<p>Beach School, Forest School and library visits are now part of our core curriculum offer.</p>
